### **Youth Leaders**

The work of Girls Inc. could not be accomplished without the skills of our Youth Leaders who make a yearlong commitment to sharing their knowledge and passion for these programs with girls younger than they. The Youth Leaders are teens that have successfully completed the ECHO Program. The Youth Leader Program provides these young women the opportunity to practice what they've learned in the ECHO Program. Each year we hire and train 25-30 Youth Leaders to deliver programs to young women and girls in high school and middle school. They co-facilitate the ECHO Leadership Program, Will Power/Won't Power and the Friendly PEERsuasion Program. During the summer the youth leaders also facilitate the Smart Choices and the Strong, Smart and Bold Summer program. They are all juniors and seniors in high school and work in their home communities as Youth Leaders.

### **ECHO Mentors**

They are professional women, college graduates, mostly bilingual/bi-literate who receive several hours of training in facilitation skills and the content of the ECHO program to prepare them to work with the Youth Leaders and ECHO participants.
